

Funding Opportunities to Attend a Gordon Conference in 2003

The Gordon Research Conferences (GRC) provides an international forum for the presentation and discussion of cutting edge research in biological, chemical, physical science and other related fields. GRC holds approximately 170 scientific conferences each year at various locations throughout the year. During the year 2003, meetings will be held in California (winter), Italy (Spring), New England (Summer), Oxford (Summer-Fall), Hong Kong (Spring), and Montana (Summer-Fall).

Through a grant received from The David & Lucile Packard Foundation, GRC has limited funds remaining to support the participation of faculty and students from selected minority-serving institutions (HBCU, HSI, and TCU) to attend a Gordon Conference. The Gordon Research Conferences also has some limited funds available to support eligible minority applicants to attend a Gordon Conference (eligibility is limited to African American/Black, Hispanic, Native American, Alaskan Natives, and Native Pacific Islanders, and applicants must be US Citizens or permanent residents working at US institutions).

For both programs, the interested applicant will need to apply and be accepted to the Conference by the Conference Chair. On the registration form is a check-off box to indicate your interest in receiving the funds. If you are accepted to the conference, \$600 will be available to the applicant to participate in the meeting.
