

Medical Educator (Assistant or Associate Professor)

Eastern Virginia Medical School (EVMS) seeks Medical Educators at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor to teach in their MD program. An ideal candidate will have expertise in either human physiology, pathology and pathophysiology, anatomy, biochemistry or pharmacology. The Medical Educator will join an interdisciplinary team of basic science and clinician educators working to develop and deliver an integrated curriculum utilizing learner-centered modalities.

The modules in the M1 and M2 years consist of foundational sciences and anatomy in the Fall of M1 year, followed by introduction to diseases and subsequently organ systems modules for the remainder of the M1 and M2 years. Each module is led by at least one basic science and one clinical faculty. Each discipline (anatomy, physiology, pathology etc.) has expert discipline directors and our curricular threads (clinical skills, chronic disease prevention and management, high value care, etc.) have expert thread directors. Curricular integration in modules is ensured by module directors working closely with discipline and thread directors.

The Medical Educator will serve as a module and/or discipline director and be experienced in putting together courses and modules in a similar setting. Experience in organizing and facilitating small groups, ability to use modern technology to engage learners in the classroom and remotely, knowledge in multiple modes of assessments, and interest in educational scholarship is highly preferred. Our faculty receive support from an instructional designer devoted to the M1/M2 years and a curriculum coordinator for each of the M1 and M2 years.

- Teaching within your area(s) of expertise
- Facilitating small groups
- Learner assessment
- Medical education research and related scholarly work
- Active participation on Committees
