

Assistant or Associate Professor of Pharmacology and Physiology

The Department of Pharmacology and Physiology of Oklahoma State University Center for Health Sciences invites applications for two tenure or non-tenure track, full time (12 month) faculty positions at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor. The successful candidates must have an earned Pharm. D. or Ph.D in Pharmacology or Physiology, with demonstrated teaching experience and effectiveness in medical education. The candidates must be proficient in instructional technology and distant education technology. The candidates must have devoted interest in osteopathic medical education. These positions will consist of teaching, research/scholarship, service/outreach, and administration duties. Research/scholarship is expected and may include, but not limited to, mentoring medical and graduate students, publishing peer – reviewed articles, and an active member in their professional society. While there will be no bench research/laboratory space available at the OSUCOM-CN campus there may be modest start-up funding available through the Office of Research for individual or collaborative research at the OSU CHS Tulsa campus. The two professor positions will be based at the OSU College of Osteopathic Medicine – Cherokee Nations (OSUCOM-CN) campus in Tahlequah, Oklahoma.
